TRIVIA: A.M. Carlson (Continued) 3. Jesus taught them about the Kingdom of God. To teach others about our Lord, we must know our faith. Our belief and faith do not need to be confined to a weekend (Sunday) mass and then leaving it within the parish walls when we walk out of mass. If we treat our faith as another "to do" item on our weekly list of "thing to do," then we will not know our faith, our Lord, well enough to teach others. Jesus instructs them about the faith. He expects us to do the same with those we love. He is waiting for us to know our faith well enough to pass it on to our family, friends, and neighbors. 4. Jesus instructed the Disciples to be patient: "while meeting with them, he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the promise of the Father about which your heard me speak." Patience is not a virtue of most people. Jesus tells them to be be patient and to wait for what comes next. He did not specify when it will take place, where it will take place, or what exactly they are waiting for. Our society is a now society. We want things now. Jesus wanted them to have the experiences of the decent of the Holy Spirit and His Ascension.
