Twenty-ninth Sunday of Ordinary Time

Our own natural inclination most likely would be to react like the other ten Apostles and become vexed with James and John and to tell them what we thought of their selfish worldly ambitions. However, our Lord's gentle answer: "You do not know what you are asking" shows us that ignorance of the nature of the kingdom he was going to set up, was the cause of their very human ambitions.

Jesus, knowing that his Apostles still had this wrong idea, was gentle with James and John. He took this opportunity to tell them that he would set up a glorious kingdom but that his sufferings and death would be a necessary prelude to its establishment. He had already referred to his sufferings and death three times, but the mention fell on deaf ears. Their argument was: how could he suffer death when he has still to establish his earthly kingdom? The truth in fact was that it was by means of his sufferings and death that he would establish his glorious kingdom. He challenged the two Apostles then to know if they were willing to pay the price for a high place in his glorious kingdom: were they prepared to follow him through suffering and death? He accepted their affirmation, knowing it to be true, but told them their position of honor depended on his Father's decision. Once they realized the nature of his glorious kingdom they would be the last to look for positions of honor in it.

October—The Holy Rosary
 The Church dedicates the month of October to The Holy Rosary. This Devotion commemorates the naval victory of a coalition of Catholic countries against the Ottoman Empire on Oct. 7, 1571. The victory was attributed directly to the rosaries prayed by the Catholic naval forces. As a result of this victory, Oct 7 is celebrated as the Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary. In 1208, St. Dominic Guzman experienced a vision of the Blessed Virgin Mary during which she gave him a rosary. The spread of the Rosary is attributed to St.. Dominic and the preaching of the Dominican Order.
 In meditating on the Mysteries of the Holy Rosary, our Lord's example and that of His Mother are brought forth to be our encouragement and the sure path through life's joys and sorrows. Our Lady commanded us both at Lourdes and Fatima to pray the Rosary for the salvation of mankind and the reparation of all sins against God.
